Aniconic- not made after a likeness; not representational

Arabesque- ornamental design of intertwined flowing lines, often found in Islamic art

Atmospheric Perspective- a system of perspective in which objects further away get smaller and blurrier than objects closer to the viewer

Background- the part of the image furthest from the viewer, often the scenery behind the main subject of the image

Baptistery -a church or part of a church used for baptism

Calligraphy- decorative handwritten lettering

Continuous narrative- illustrates multiple scenes from a story in a single image; each scene is distinguished by the repetition of the main character(s)

Foreground- the part of the image that is nearest to the viewer

Foreshortening- technique to create the illusion of an object receding strongly into the distance of background

Genre scene- image of daily life

Horizon Line- the line that separates ground and sky in a painting

Hypostyle- describes any room that is filled with columns

Illusionistic- art that attempts to represent physical appears so precisely so as to trick the viewer into thinking they are not looking at a painting

Manuscript- any book that is handwritten (as opposed to typed or printed)

Middle ground- the middle part of an image

Mihrab- prayer niche in an Islamic prayer hall that identifies which wall faces Mecca

Minaret- tower in a mosque complex from which the call to prayer is announced

Mosque- a Muslim place of worship

Narrative Cycle- a group of images that tells a story

Narrative Image- an image that tells a story

Niche- shallow recess, usually in a wall

Oil paint- paint where oil is used to bind the pigment, as opposed to encaustic or tempera Orthogonal Line- lines that recede into the space of a painting and meet at the vanishing point Qibla- the direction that one prays in in Muslim worship (the direction of Mecca) Relic- a part of a deceased holy person's body or belongings kept as an object of reverence Reliquary- a container for holy relics Script- a style of writing Series- multiple works of art made as a group Tenebrism- intense chiaroscuro

Vanishing Point- the point at which the orthogonal lines viewer in perspective appear to converge
